
scheduled in the coming weeks. There is always much to be done here, but we believe our guests this summer will enjoy the beauty of the campus.

By Action of the Board

There has been much discussion over the past 3 years concerning "active shooters", "concealed carry" and related firearms topics at the Board meetings. In the April meeting, a policy that was previously adopted was rescinded and replaced with a fairly simple policy. In short, Grand Oaks remains mostly a weapon free zone with exceptions. Those are: no one is to bring a weapon on campus unless they have a valid state issued conceal carry permit and they have obtained permission from the event group leader. That group is also required to inform the camp resident manager of any weapons brought on campus. The other "exceptions" are for weapons owned by the camp employees and those used in any event that has been approved by the Grand Oaks Board. That means that event planners can now request permission for possession or use of firearms for specific events on a case by case basis. The Board retains authority to approve or deny such use.

Also in the April meeting, a schedule for 2018 was approved and the schedule process going forward will be discussed further in October. The 2018 schedule is on the Grand Oaks website calendar.

Volunteers Welcome
