## Summer is here and already half over!

Summer is here and so are our camps. We currently are hosting nearly 200 people from the North Grand River and Harrison Associations for Children’s camp. Along with camps we are hosting several pool parties. The weather has been favorable and the water temperature pleasant at the pool. We have had a couple of family reunions and are expecting more this month and next. Our summer started off right after Memorial Day with the North Grand River and Harrison Associations for Youth camp. The total attending was 108 campers and staff. It was good to visit with the new camp director Chase Roberts and see what ideas he brought. The Fusion team from Mid-Western Baptist Theological Seminary helped with praise and worship along with being camp leaders and

counselors. Our second camp was the St. Joseph Baptist Association Youth led by Jesse Fisher. Camp was filled with 182 campers and by weeks end 12 new professions of faith were made. Much like the previous group, SJBA brought in a college group to help with camp. New Edition led by Sabrina Brookshire came and provided much needed help as cabin leaders, counselors, praise/drama team, and helped gather media to present. New Edition also attended the next two weeks of camp with the New Life and Linn/Livingston 1000 Hills Youth groups. They were such an instrumental part of each camp and highly enjoyed by all. The New Life Baptist Association held their Children and Youth camp next. Brian Sparks led the 217 person camp. Many activities were held and the weather cooperated. It is a pleasure to see the well planned out workings of a camp of their size

and complexity. At the end of the week five people made professions of faith. Following New Life was the Linn/Livingston 1000 Hills Youth camp led by Travis Smith. This was his second year as Camp Director. Since the camp is close to home for this group, lots of support staff come out just during the day to cook and lead sessions. All told there were 141 campers for the week. As soon as they left, the camp was prepped for the next group that came in that same day. “Perfect Praise,” our Into to Camp session geared toward children in grades one to three, took place on Friday afternoon until early Saturday afternoon. The response from those in attendance was very positive about their time and experience as a camper. Our hope is that this event will lessen the potential anxiety of both the children and the parents about attending camp.

There are many elective activities that are offered from fishing, archery, leather craft, music, drama, geology and more. We hope to finish strong this week and for the summer. There are five more camps to go and we welcome your prayers and support. We hope to see the Spirit move in these young people and see lives transformed!
