2019 Summer Camp Season Summary

We left off in the last newsletter with the North Grand River and Harrison Associations’ Children’s Camp. Eric Spears directed the week once again this year. There were 194 in attendance with 19 new salvations recorded and 46 rededications to Christ. The next camp was our largest of the summer: Saint Joseph Children’s Camp with 253 in attendance. David Long led the week and it was well-run as usual with lots of fun recreation activities and plenty of time in the pool. They recorded fifteen new salvations and four rededications. Missouri Valley Youth Camp was next, led by Marita Avilez. They came in at the end of July with 110 in attendance. One rededication was recorded for the week. If you’re interested in improving security measures for your week of

camp, this is the association to ask about how to do it. They bring dedicated security staff who do a wonderful job of patrolling and securing the campus throughout the week. Next to come was the Heartland Association Children’s Camp directed by David Nixdorf, aka: Big Dave. This was a small group at the end of July with 80 total, but it came with plenty of personality. Two new salvations were recorded along with five rededications. The Linn-Livingston Children’s Camp came over the last few days of July and first couple days of August with 115 campers and workers. Brother David Gouge led the week again this year. Following dismissal on Friday, he left to start work at his new church in the Saint Joseph Baptist Association the following Sunday. Bro. Gouge’s presence will be missed in the LLBA but we hope to see him back at camp next summer with SJBA’s camps. The Heartland

Youth camp was the final camp of the 2019 camp season and was led by lay person, Aaron Gudde. There were 107 in attendance for the week; four new salvations and 7 rededications were reported. Praise the Lord for his unending faithfulness in the lives of young people, even amidst a time of confusion and uncertainty for the campers who came from the small town of Braymer that week, a community which had been in the news the week leading up to this camp. Nearly 30 more people attended camp in 2019 than in 2018. That’s nearly 30 more people who were possibly exposed to the Gospel for the first time, or made to feel welcome among strangers for the first time, or shown they have inherent value in Christ for the first time. Your continued prayers over the work that the Lord is doing at Grand Oaks are bringing the light of Jesus to North Missouri, and we thank you.
