2017 Summer Camp Report

Summer Camps

We were in the final week of camp as I first wrote this report. Both Assistant Manager Brad and I (Don) were experiencing something new that week as Brad ran the sound board for evening worship and I was on bass for the worship band. Tuesday evening was good, but Wednesday night was a whole other experience as the children sang <u>Just As I Am/</u> Broken To Be Mended. Being up front and hearing those voices was quite a blessing. Of course, someone could share that testimony on most any night of the summer as our Lord is worshipped each evening of camp. This summer we have seen 1,350 children and youth register along with 488 adults. Add pre-campers and the total is 1,856-just above the total for 2016. Each group varies, but typically there are from 5 to who knows how many "day workers" that come in and out to help. It was a typical summer at camp with a little sun burn, some wasp stings and a few broken bones. But there were also lots of new experiences, new friends and some lifetime memories. The bottom line, though, is the statistic that reflects eternity. There were 103 professions of faith made at camp this summer, including one of the kitchen volunteers. We are praising God for all that were drawn closer to HIM because of the ministry of Grand Oaks. **Campus Updates**

We have seen several improvements and regular maintenance advancements this past year. New roofs have been installed on the Riverview Cabins, the Nurse Cabin, the storeroom and the old pump house by Steen Lake. The loan of a platform lift tool allowed us to trim a great many of the old white oaks and other trees around the campus, making it much safer to be under those trees! The Heartland Association provided labor and leadership for constructing a porch on the front of the Nurse Cabin. This improvement has been greatly appreciated by the nurses and the campers visiting the nurse—especially on rainy days or hot sunny days. A project undertaken over the winter has resulted in a noticeable saving of electricity this sum-

Two major purchases this year were the total replacement of one of the heating/cooling units in the chapel and the acquisition of a lightly used 72" John Deere zero turn mowing machine. An injury that left manager Boyer hobbled most of the summer made this a near necessity to allow him to continue the mowing while manager Fields took over a great deal of the "leg work"!

We are currently booking dates for winter retreats and other off season events. We have hosted quite a number of family gatherings and swim parties this season. A new partnership began in January as the Grace Family Fellowship church began renting space here each Sunday. That will continue through most of the fall until they move into space they have purchased in town. We recently hosted a home school family retreat focusing on God's Wonders of Creation with the event built around the Solar Eclipse. Just over 100 people from 3 states participated in the event.
