Progress update on Parker Hall

Spring preparations are beginning at Grand Oaks. Soon enough the buildings will need to be dewinterized and cleaned up. We welcome any assistance if you or someone you know would like to take a day to volunteer. A few spring retreats and events visited Grand Oaks. We are well underway on the deconstruction of Parker Hall. I have to say thank you to the many people from Laura Street Baptist Church and friends that came and helped in the deconstruction of Parker Hall. One recent retreat, the Missouri Valley Youth, also helped in this process. As time moves on, progress continues in the goal of removing Parker Hall by the time sum-

mer camps begin.

Included in this Newsletter are pictures of the progression of the deconstruction. We will continue to post progress pictures to Facebook and send out updates periodically. As of writing this, the appearance of Parker Hall has dramatically changed. We have been working in earnest on dismantling the structure before the summer camp season begins. Currently all of the hardwood flooring is removed, bundled and stored. If we have someone that is interested in obtaining some of the flooring, we would be happy to discuss how that can happen. The white siding panels have been removed on three sides along with the fiberboard that was applied originally. The east side of the building is all that has anything still attached

to it as the terrain and height makes it challenging to work on. We've thought of various methods of taking that wall down and have determined we would like to avoid winning a Darwin award. With that we have elected the less spectacular methods of removal for that wall. The remaining walls are down to the bare two by four wood framing. All of the shingles on the roof are removed and the upper roof deck planks are removed. Don has been steady as he goes, removing each nail one at a time, one board at a time. We have reclaimed some potential good lumber, some being one by six, eight, ten and twelve in boards. If you or someone you know has need of such material give us a call. Our next stage is removing the roof trusses. Once those are down, we will move on to removing the lower roof deck planks. After those are off then the frame will be dismantled. At that point just the sub-floor should remain and then that will be removed. We will continue to reclaim all the material we can. We will have to demolish the basement block and concrete pad after that. Once again if there is an interest that one has to come and be a part of the tear down process or help in other ways, we welcome the assistance.
