## CAMPERS, PARENTS, AND STAFF GENERAL INFORMATION SHEET

NOTE: THIS INFORMATION SHEET IS FOR YOUR USE. DO NOT RETURN IT WITH YOUR REGISTRATION FORM.

#### I. REGISTRATION:

- A. The camp fee this year is: Camper \$30; Cabin Leader \$30. Registration and the full camper's fee must be turned into the church and received at Grand Oaks Camp by the deadline date. (Registration Deadline is June 17, 2024.) No Registrations will be accepted after the deadline date. If the camper is not able to attend camp, a total refund will be given. Churches are required to send an adult Cabin Leader with the campers. We recommend parents, or guardians to attend with their children. Cabin Leaders must be 21 years of age or older (C.I.T.'s must be 18 years of age by the beginning of camp).
- B. Onsite camp registration begins at 3:30pm on Friday and this camp ends at 2:00pm on Saturday. Parents need to pick up children at 1:00pm.
- C. ONLY those who have completed FIRST, SECOND, AND THIRD GRADES are eligible for enrollment in the Intro to Camping. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS, SO PLEASE DO NOT ASK FOR SPECIAL CONSIDERATION!
- D. There will be no refund of camp fees (whole or part) after Friday, the opening day of camp.

#### II DRESS CODE

- A. Remember that this is a CHRISTIAN CAMP Clothing will be modest and appropriate for a Christian atmosphere.
- B. Clothing (shirts, skirts, caps, etc.) with inappropriate slogans or advertisements (such as, alcohol, tobacco, vulgar language, etc) cannot be worn at camp. The camper will be asked to change clothing if he/she wears such an item.
- C. Short shorts, short skirts cannot be worn. Short skorts, spaghetti strap blouses or tank tops are inappropriate attire for a Christian atmosphere. Shorts may be worn at recreation times. No Soffe Shorts or Skirts can be worn.
- D. SHIRTS AND SHOES ARE TO BE WORN AT ALL TIMES. (The only exception is IN the pool).

#### II. WHAT TO BRING: (AND NOT TO BRING)

- A. Bring adequate changes of clothing for two days (one change per day), sport shoes, shorts for recreation, jacket, raincoat or umbrella, clothes hangers, toilet articles (soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, deodorant, etc.), towels, wash cloths, bedding, a pillow, and a backpack or tote bag. Bring a Bible, notebook, pencil, flashlight.
- B. Please mark all items brought to camp.
- C. Please do not bring electronic devices to camp. If they are brought to camp, we discourage their use. The camp is not responsible for loss or theft of such items.
- D. Do not bring personal refrigerators or air conditioners. Fans are permitted.
- E. Do not bring alcohol, fireworks, matches, lighters, tobacco, etc. These items will be confiscated by the staff.
- F. Campers are not to trade clothing. CLOTHING SHOULD BE MARKED WITH THE CAMPER'S NAME.
- G. If you take medications, be sure to bring them with proper instructions. ALL MEDICATIONS, EXCEPT THOSE APPROVED BY CAMP NURSE, WILL BE PLACED IN THE CARE AND DISPENSED BY THE CAMP NURSE.

#### III. MEDICAL INFORMATION

- A. Prescription medicines must be sent in original containers.
- B. Please do not send pre-drawn syringes of medications. If your child requires injectable medicines of any kind you will need to send original vial of medication and syringes.
- C. If your child is a **type I Diabetic** you must send the following items for your child to attend camp:
  - (1) Glucometer / Strips / Iancets, (2) Glucagon Pen (No exceptions),
  - (3) Insulin / syringes (4) Glucogel or Glucose tabs.
- D. If your child has asthma and uses a nebulizer in addition to an inhaler, please send the nebulizer, medication & dilutant to camp. Asthma is easily triggered by the activities at camp.
- E. If your child has severe allergies and uses an epi-pen, please contact the Camp Director and/or Mission Center before the beginning of camp.
- F. We do not give allergy or growth hormone injections at camp.

#### V. PHONE CALLS AT CAMP:

A. If an emergency arises and it becomes necessary to contact someone attending camp, call 660-646-1906. You can be sure if there is a problem, you will be promptly notified. Campers will be allowed to call home only in an emergency.

#### VI. GENERAL INFORMATION:

- A. Your child's photo and or video, may be taken at camp. By sending your child to this camp, you are giving permission for Grand Oaks Baptist Assembly to use those photos, or video in materials to promote Grand Oak's camping programs. This may include brochures, power point presentations, Facebook posts, Instagram posts, or on our website. Photos and video will not be used for any other purposes.
- B. Campers are not permitted to leave the camp facility during camp, except with parents, (parents will sign a release form) and with the permission of the Camp Director. This is for the safety and welfare of the camper. The Camp Director must give permission for a camper and/or staff to leave the campus prior to the end of camp.
- C. Campers and Cabin Leaders must remain in their cabins during lights out time. Visiting and disturbing other cabins will not be tolerated.
- D. No vehicles are to be driven or ridden during the camp without the Camp Director's permission.
